WELCOME

ALL SAINTS TO ADVENT

From All Saints' Day we enter the time of the Christian year that is sometimes called 'The Kingdom Season'. It is a season of remembering, recalling the saints who have gone before us, the faithful departed on All Souls' Day, and celebrating on Remembrance Sunday those who have given their lives in war. We wait for the final consummation of God's new creation in Christ; those who are Christ's, whether or not they have passed through death, are joined in prayer that God's kingdom will be revealed finally and in all its fullness. The annual cycle of the Church's year then ends with the Feast of Christ the King, which returns us to the Advent theme of judgement.

GUILDFORD TOWN CENTRE CHAPLAINCY - GTCC

During the service this evening, new volunteers of GTCC will be commissioned.

GTCC was founded by the Churches of Guildford to support the hidden and vulnerable in our town. In our sixteen years of operation we have reached out and supported many, and are now seen as a well-respected, award winning, charity. We have three projects:

Street Angels – Who go out every Friday and Saturday night between the hours of 10.30 and 4am. Our trained volunteers offer compassion and practical support, made possible by our strong working partnership with the local authority, emergency services and other community organisations.

Volunteer Chaplains – Can be found in Hostels, GP surgeries, Schools, Police, Churches, Retirement complex's, Night time venues, Entertainment and others places. They offer non-judgemental care and support by providing a safe place for people to be listened to.

Community Angels - Support some of the most lonely and vulnerable adults in our community. Clients are referred to us by different agencies such as Social Prescribing, GP's, Police and other individuals. Our volunteers come alongside, offering non-judgemental care for six months on a weekly basis helping to build confidence and reconnection. This project seeks to respond to growing demand to tackle social isolation.

GTCC – All volunteers are trained, supported, supervised and DBS checked. Currently we have over 130 volunteers across our three projects.

Sit OLD TESTAMENT Daniel 2.1, 25-48

read by Michael More-Molyneux, Lord Lieutenant of Surrey

The first lesson is written in the second chapter of the Book of Daniel, beginning at the first verse.

In the second year of Nebuchadnezzar's reign, Nebuchadnezzar dreamed such dreams that his spirit was troubled and his sleep left him.

Then Arioch quickly brought Daniel before the king and said to him: 'I have found among the exiles from Judah a man who can tell the king the interpretation.' The king said to Daniel, whose name was Belteshazzar, 'Are you able to tell me the dream that I have seen and its interpretation?' Daniel answered the king, 'No wise men, enchanters, magicians, or diviners can show to the king the mystery that the king is asking, but there is a God in heaven who reveals mysteries, and he has disclosed to King Nebuchadnezzar what will happen at the end of days. Your dream and the visions of your head as you lay in bed were these: To you, O king, as you lay in bed, came thoughts of what would be hereafter, and the revealer of mysteries disclosed to you what is to be. But as for me, this mystery has not been revealed to me because of any wisdom that I have more than any other living being, but in order that the interpretation may be known to the king and that you may understand the thoughts of your mind.

You were looking, O king, and lo! there was a great statue. This statue was huge, its brilliance extraordinary; it was standing before you, and its appearance was frightening. The head of that statue was of fine gold, its chest and arms of silver, its middle and thighs of bronze, its legs of iron, its feet partly of iron and partly of clay. As you looked on, a stone was cut out, not by human hands, and it struck the statue on its feet of iron and clay and broke them in pieces. Then the iron, the clay, the bronze, the silver, and the gold, were all broken in pieces and became like the chaff of the summer threshing-floors; and the wind carried them away, so that not a trace of them could be found. But the stone that struck the statue became a great mountain and filled the whole earth.

'This was the dream; now we will tell the king its interpretation. You, O king, the king of kings—to whom the God of heaven has given the kingdom, the power, the might, and the glory, into whose hand he has given human beings, wherever they live, the wild animals of the field, and the birds of the air, and whom he has established as ruler over them all you are the head of gold. After you shall arise another kingdom inferior to yours, and yet a third kingdom of bronze, which shall rule over the

whole earth. And there shall be a fourth kingdom, strong as iron; just as iron crushes and smashes everything, it shall crush and shatter all these. As you saw the feet and toes partly of potter's clay and partly of iron, it shall be a divided kingdom; but some of the strength of iron shall be in it, as you saw the iron mixed with the clay. As the toes of the feet were part iron and part clay, so the kingdom shall be partly strong and partly brittle. As you saw the iron mixed with clay, so will they mix with one another in marriage, but they will not hold together, just as iron does not mix with clay. And in the days of those kings the God of heaven will set up a kingdom that shall never be destroyed, nor shall this kingdom be left to another people. It shall crush all these kingdoms and bring them to an end, and it shall stand for ever; just as you saw that a stone was cut from the mountain not by hands, and that it crushed the iron, the bronze, the clay, the silver, and the gold. The great God has informed the king what shall be hereafter. The dream is certain, and its interpretation trustworthy.'

Then King Nebuchadnezzar fell on his face, worshipped Daniel, and commanded that a grain-offering and incense be offered to him. The king said to Daniel, 'Truly, your God is God of gods and Lord of kings and a revealer of mysteries, for you have been able to reveal this mystery!' Then the king promoted Daniel, gave him many great gifts, and made him ruler over the whole province of Babylon and chief prefect over all the wise men of Babylon.

Here ends the first lesson.

Sit **NEW TESTAMENT** Revelation 7.9-17 read by Chief Superintendent Mark Chapman, Surrey Police

The second lesson is written in the seventh chapter of the Revelation to John, beginning at the ninth verse.

After this I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice, saying, 'Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!' And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshipped God, singing, 'Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honour and power and might be to our God for ever and ever! Amen.'

Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, 'Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?' I said to him, 'Sir, you are the one that knows.' Then he said to me, 'These are they who have come out of the great ordeal; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. For this reason they are before the throne of God, and worship him day and night within his temple, and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them. They will hunger no more, and thirst no more; the sun will not strike them, nor any scorching heat; for the Lamb at the centre of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of the water of life, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes.'

Here ends the second lesson.
