Opening Hours the Cathedral, Shop and Seasons

- 4. The Cathedral opening times are as follows:
 - Sunday 7.30am to 5pm.
 - Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday 8.30am to 5pm.
 - Tuesday 7.30am to 5pm.
 - Saturday 8.30am to 5pm.

The Shop is open from Monday to Saturday from 9.30am until 4.30pm. Seasons is open from Monday to Saturday from 9am until 3pm, and on Sunday from 9am until 12 noon.

Chapter

5. Chapter met on 14 January and were briefed on the financial situation; the budget was approved in December after the overall predicted deficit had been reduced following work by a budget working group. Chapter were also informed of developments in the governance of Safeguarding at a national and Diocesan level, and any potential impact on the Cathedral.

Bellringing

6. In addition to normal service and practice ringing, the bells were rung twice on Christmas Eve, for the main service on Christmas Day and prior to the Gordon's School service on 19th January. For the Installation of our new Dean the bells were rung prior to the service and afterwards, as is usual for new Deans and Bishops, a full peal of Yorkshire Surprise Maximus was rung taking 3 hours and 30 minutes. A peal was also rung on Saturday 18 January by a band of mainly local members of the Ancient Society of College Youths (a ringing society founded in 1637, based in London but with members all over the world) to mark the 300th anniversary of the Society's first peal, which was also the first ever peal on 12 bells. Since the last Senior Volunteers meeting five quarter peals were rung, two of which enabled Emma and Katy Shepherd, who only started ringing in June 2023, to ring their firsts of Cinques and Maximus. Finally, a selected Cathedral band has started practising for the qualifying round of the National 12-Bell Contest at Liverpool Parish Church (St Nicholas, Pier Head) on 22 March.

Development Department

7. Congratulations to Nicola Pratt, Head of Development, for confirmation of a £3,000 grant for the Organ Scholar's salary (via an application and relationship she holds) and to Karen Taylor, Fundraising Officer, who received a £3,000 cheque this week from a trust for the Organ Scholar's salary from an application she made in October!

Facilities

8. There has been work done on pointing the brick wall above the Development Office to eliminate water incursion. Groundwork has been undertaken to address health and safety concerns on the footpath to the Close. There have also been quotations from Aimis Trees to tackle some concerns about trees that appear to be unstable and to "lift" trees that are on Cathedral land to comply with transport requirements.

Families Engagement and Schools

9. Nicola Cole, Head of Schools, conducted the annual visit from RGS Pre-prep on 14 January. She then attended the 'Cathedrals Plus' conference in Peterborough, to share ideas about welcoming people to cathedrals. She is working on a number of forthcoming school visits and rolling out a programme of 'Godly Play' (a creative, imaginative approach to Christian formation and spiritual guidance) events.

Liturgy and Music

10. Monday 6 January saw the Feast of Epiphany Eucharist being sung by the Whyte Effect. The choir and musicians returned after the Christmas break to sing the Epiphanytide Procession and Carol Service on Sunday 12 January. On Tuesday 14 January a highly successful Evensong with the RGS pre prep boys (Year 2) took place, following an afternoon of workshops with the Cathedral's very own Nicola Cole (cf para 9 above). Thirty year two boys from RGS pre prep sang the anthem by themselves to a very appreciative congregation and the boy choristers sang much of the service by themselves. Everyone worked extremely hard in preparation for the Dean's Installation Service — choir, musicians, including deputy singers joining the team and Septura Brass - who made a special arrangement fo the 'exit' music, 'Crown Imperial' by William Walton. The service was a wonderful success. Services fro Candlemas take place on Sunday 2 February.
